Insurance Companies Offer Benefits to "Clean Marinas"

Insurance companies have begun to recognize the efforts marinas are making to help keep the environment clean by becoming a "Clean Marina." Once a marina has achieved this status, it may become eligible for rewards such as premium reductions and policy enhancements.

The John B. Wright insurance agency has negotiated with an insurance company to provide benefits to eligible marinas. Some of the benefits included:

1. 10% Clean Marina Credit on the marine facility liability premium.
2. Automatically include a \$1 million Pollution Liability Limit for the marina facility.
3. Adding Underground Storage Tank (UST) or Aboveground Storage Tank (AST) coverage as part of the marina package on a separate claims made policy form.
4. Non-auditable liability form for prior year exposures.

Shrink Wrap Recycling Update



Currently, there are numerous drop off locations and other options where boaters and marina owners can recycle shrink wrap. Thanks to a grant from *I BOAT NJ*, there will be approximately 24 additional drop off locations this spring. The following counties have received funds to start or expand existing shrink wrap collection efforts:

- **Atlantic** – Expand existing collection program and outreach effort
- **Burlington** – Start a collection program
- **Cape May** – Expand existing collection program and outreach effort
- **Cumberland** – Expand existing collection program and outreach effort
- **Middlesex** – Start a collection program at the Middlesex County Division of Solid Waste and produce educational materials
- **Morris** – Start a collection program at the Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority and produce educational materials
- **Ocean** – Expand existing collection program by adding new locations in Brick Township, Point Pleasant, Toms River and Waretown
- **Sussex** – Start a collection program at the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority and educational materials
- **Union** – Start a collection program at the Elizabeth Marina and produce educational materials

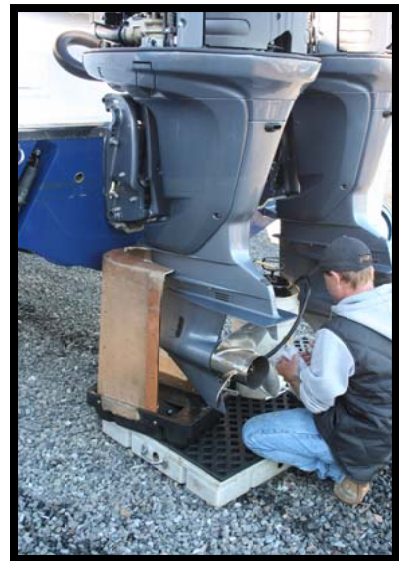

2007 Operation and Maintenance Funding Agreements are Due!

Up to \$1,500 in expenses will be reimbursed per marina for the operation and maintenance of pumpout equipment during the 2007 boating season. Marinas can be reimbursed for pumpout staff costs, repairs, maintenance, and boat sewage hauling fees, less any income generated from fees charged for pumpout service.
